VISION

The vision has been delineated in the so called ISTAG report "Scenarios for Ambient Intelligence in 2010". The four presented scenarios envision the way of living and working in the year 2010. The year 2010 is, therefore, amenable to review the state of the art of current technological but also social, economical, political aspects trough the prism of the four scenarios.

We seek chapters that should focus on a current level of a technological implementation or a present status of social, legal, economic etc. aspects outlined in one of the scenarios. Chapters must reflect and fit into either the framework given by the vision published in the so called ISTAG report or in the two additional chapters called "Emerging Technologies for Aml" and "Quo Vadis Ambient Intelligence?", otherwise they cannot be published.

SUBMISSION PROCEDURE

The organizers welcome 2 page proposals outlining the objectives and approach of the proposed chapters. The proposals will be reviewed by an editorial board and the authors of accepted proposals will be sent chapter guidelines. The full chapters should extent 15-20 pages. All chapters will undergo another round of a review process to provide a feedback for the camera ready version of the chapter.

PUBLISHER

The book will be published by IOS PRESS Amsterdam in the series Ambient Intelligence and Smart Environments. The book will be indexed in the Web of Science. The publication is anticipated to be released in May 2011.
