Nomination Process	Interested students must be nominated by the home institution. Completed nomination form should be sent to GAO at <u>inbound@eduhk.hk</u> by the nomination deadline. Student data will then be imported to the application platform named Global Engagement Management System (GEMS) after nomination.

Application Process	Applicants are REQUIRED to complete the application online and submit the following documents to EdUHK via GEMS or mailing as appropriate before the deadline stipulated. <b>Documents Required – to be uploaded to GEMS:</b> -A scanned copy of official transcript -A scanned copy of TOEFL/IELTS scoresheet or English Proficiency Endorsement Form <b>Documents Required – to be mailed to EdUHK:</b> - Visa application		
Student Visa Application	Applicants shall download the application form from the Hong Kong Immigration Department and submit the <b>ORIGINAL</b> visa application with photocopies of all necessary supporting documents to GAO by courier before the application deadline stipulated.		





	It normally takes around <b>6 weeks</b> to process a visa application. Once a visa is issued, the e-visa will be sent to students' email. The visa should be saved in soft copy on a mobile device or printed on a piece of A4 white paper.
Insurance	Exchange students must arrange travel and health insurance covering the entire period of stay in Hong Kong. Insurance should cover (but not be limited to) travel, personal accident, medical expenses (accident and non-accident), hospitalisation and emergency evacuation/repatriation.
	There is no requirement on the amount of insurance coverage. This will depend on individual needs. They will be required to show proof of coverage prior to arrival/registration.
